Locating Your Library Course Guide

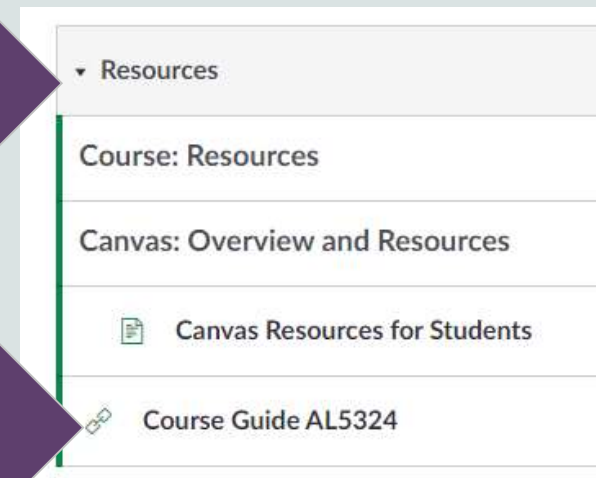
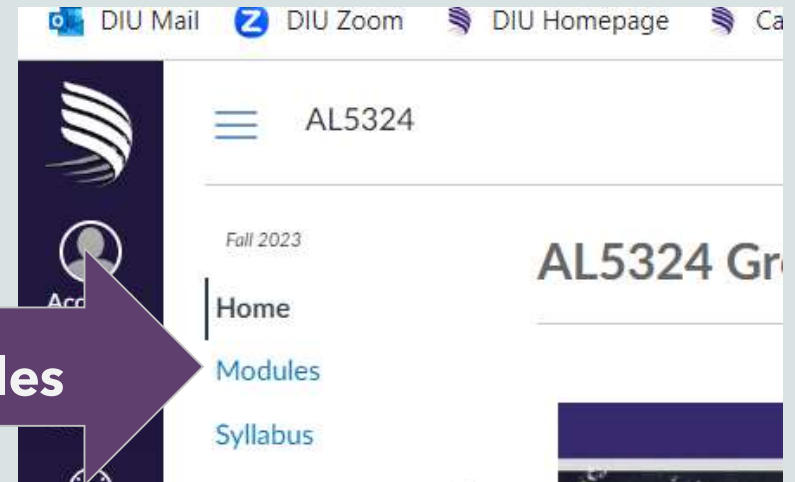
Digital versions of the required readings selected by your Professor are placed on a library course guide by library staff members. The guide is then uploaded into your Canvas course. To find the guide from inside your Canvas course, open the course, click on the 'modules' link in the left side menu, then scroll down to the 'resources' section to find your course guide link.

For this example, we have used AL5324, but you will follow these basic steps with any of your courses for which a Professor tells you they had a Course Guide created.


On campus students may visit the library to check out print copies of these items. Your professor has designated a checkout period of 2 hours.

When first published in 1983, *Biblical Words and Their Meaning* broke new ground by introducing to students of the Bible the principles of lexical semantics -- that branch that focuses on the meaning of individual words. The book includes a bibliographical essay by Silva, "Recent Developments in Semantics," and an appendix by Karen H. Jobes, "Distinguishing the Meaning of a Word from its Domain for Worship," that provides the reader with a substantive example of lexical study.

Your required readings will be located on the Course Reserve tab, typically as links. Simply scroll down the page to find the reading – usually filed alphabetically by title – and click the link to open.

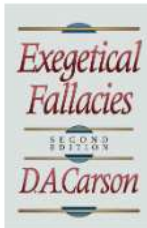

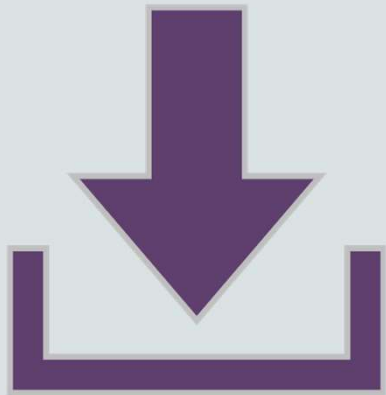
